The economic context continued to affect food security at the community and household level, and the rise in the cost of the basket of consumer goods in the last months of 2021 was a significant challenge for many families who participate in our programs.

In 2021, the COVID-19 pandemic hit our communities hard, more so than in 2020, with nearly every family being affected by the virus.

Additionally, in the last two months of the year, we observed an increase in school drop out since there was no school fees for the children and others remained orphans due to Covid 19, through our programs we can make a change in this community with the help of our donors.
